

Parent Observer Guidelines

In order to gain admittance to a CNADM Student Session classroom, you **MUST**:

- 1. Pay a \$35 fee to obtain one Observer Badge. Pay an additional \$5 for a spouse badge.**
 - These badges are reserved for adult chaperones of registered students.
 - NO children/siblings will be allowed in the Student Session classrooms with an Observer.
 - You must make arrangements, if necessary, to have children watched by a babysitter or other Observers while you are in the Student Session classroom.
 - Observers are not allowed in Ballet Forum.
- 2. You must wear** the supplied Observer Badge and wristband to gain entry to the classroom.
- 3. You must attend an Observer Orientation session.** This session will be held at 9:15 a.m. on Saturday, July 31 in the Hunt Room for Student Session.
- 4. Parents may not switch children from one classroom to another.** If you feel a child should be moved to another classroom, you must discuss this with the student's teacher. It is then the teacher's responsibility to obtain a Transfer Card at the Student Registration Desk and follow proper procedure to have the child considered for transfer.
- 5. We expect every registrant and Observer to afford each faculty member the highest level of respect.** To that end, the following activities are banned from our classrooms and anyone violating these rules will be removed from the classroom for the rest of the session:
 - **All cell phones must be turned off and stowed** during any CNADM class —this includes the phones of Student Session observers. If used, the phone will be confiscated. No photos or videos may be taken during class, including those taken from a cell phone.
 - Smoking, food and alcohol is prohibited in the classroom when class is in session and at all evening events (except where provided by the event sponsor).
 - No conversation from the side lines.
 - Video and still cameras and cassette recorders are not allowed in any classroom.
 - An Observer cannot disrupt their child or student while he/she is dancing.
- 6. A calendar of events will be posted daily** outside the classroom for each Student Session.
- 7. If you have any questions or comments,** please address them directly to the Student Chairperson (they will be introduced at the Observer Orientation Session).

If your child has any medical issues, such as asthma or diabetes, please inform the Room Chairman.

Please help us maintain our classroom dress code and code of behavior

- Please wear "cover up" clothing over dancewear and appropriate footwear whenever you are walking through the lobby of the hotel or on elevators.
- Student dress code consists of **one-piece leotard and solid-color tights** with all appropriate shoes according to dance discipline. No swimwear, midriffs, crop tops, abdomen cutouts, 2-piece thong leotards or biker shorts. This criteria is necessary as a view of body line is necessary for proper correction. No superfluous clothing may be worn over or tied to shoulders or waist.
- Students must have hair secured off the face and neck and wear minimal jewelry.
- Put your name in all dance shoes and dancewear in case of loss.
- No gum chewing.
- We want you to have an enjoyable time while you are here, but as we are not the only guests in the hotel, we request that you **please be quiet, courteous and considerate** of the other hotel guests—in your rooms, the hotel corridors, elevators and lobby.
