

# Dress Code for Teacher Rooms



Dress code in the teachers' rooms should be appropriate for the discipline being taught.

Leotard, tights, yoga pants, leggings or jazz pants and fitted shirts are all acceptable items for class. Dance shorts and tight-fitting jazz pants/leggings are permitted over leotard and tights. No exposed abdomens or bare legs (shorts without tights) are permitted.

We request that all teachers conform to our dress code for the classroom which includes wearing cover up clothing over dancewear whenever you are in the hotel lobby, hallways or on elevators.

While on the dance floor participating in class, hair needs to be secured to head off the face and neck, no pony tails.

Male dancers should wear jazz pants, sweats, or shorts and fitted tee-shirts.

No gum is permitted in any classroom.

We request adherence to this dress code in order to provide a good example to our student attendees.

# Dress Code for Student Session



CNADM dress code for all classes consists of a one-piece leotard and solid color tights with all appropriate shoes according to dance discipline.

No exposed abdomens. Short dance shorts and tight-fitting jazz pants *MAY* be permitted over a leotard and tights with the exception of ballet classes.

This criteria is necessary as a view of body line is important for proper correction. No superfluous clothing may be worn over or tied to shoulders or waist. Boys should wear jazz pants, sweats, or shorts and fitted tee-shirts, with no baggy clothing to obscure the view of the body line.

Students must have their hair secured to the head off the face and neck, no pony tails, and wear minimal jewelry on the dance floor. Please put your name in all dance shoes and dancewear in case of loss. No gum chewing!

We request that all students conform to our dress code for the classroom which includes wearing cover up clothing over dancewear whenever you are in the hotel lobby, hallways or on elevators.

Please be quiet, courteous and considerate of other hotel guests.
